Travel Management Area - Northeast Oregon Timberland Access

About the program

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's Travel Management Area (TMA)¹ restricts motorized access on certain roads in order to protect private property, reduce disturbance of wildlife from motorized vehicles, and help keep big game from moving into agricultural land during hunting seasons.



Manulife Forest Management (MFM) has decades of success with existing Travel Management Areas across Northeast Oregon (NEO). Because of our success stewarding the environment and its resources, we have chosen to enroll four additional areas in NEO into the TMA program.

 We recognize that enrollment will change access for some hunters that utilize motor vehicles. However, all hunters will still be able to access our properties through the open roads inside or adjacent to the TMAs, providing different hunting experiences desired by many.

Public use of MFM lands continues to increase. Unfortunately, illegal dumping, firewood theft, and road damage also continues to increase. Enrollment in the TMA program is one way that helps control these problems while keeping our lands open for public access and enjoyment.

1. Are all Travel Management Area roads closed?

2. Can I operate my ATV, UTV, or eBike on MFM lands in Northeast Oregon?

ATVs, UTVs, and eBikes are permitted on open roads as shown on the TMA maps above. Closed roads are closed to all motorized vehicles including all eBikes.

Exceptions apply: after January 1 with more than 12 inches of snow on the road surface, the use of snow machines, tracked ATVs and tracked UTVs are permitted.

3. How do I know where the Travel Management Areas are?
